## What is this map?

This map was created by the local cycling group Bespoke and was further developed by the Community Environment Partnership for Eastbourne (CEPE).

The idea behind this map was to make it easier for people to cycle around the town by identifying routes that are more pleasant to cycle along. Quite often these routes have much less traffic and if cyclists start to use them on a regular basis then they could become a natural corridor for bikes.

Bespoke and CEPE recognise that the town could do with more cycle lanes but a lot of journeys can still be made on two wheels as Eastbourne is not a large town and has many flat areas. And a bike will often get you there quicker than the car and of course keep you fit and save you money.
